

# Naturalistic itinerary “The venetian Barena”

Camping Venezia (Mestre) – Parco s. Giuliano – Forte Bazzera – Punta Bazzera ( Tessera)

Length: about **8.5 km** (one way)

Cycle and pedestrian path

**Suitable for everyone**

Our camping is located in a strategic position to visit the city of Venice, but also to enjoy the wonders of the hinterland.

We propose this naturalistic itinerary, tested first by our staff ☺, completely surrounded by nature where you can admire Venice from another perspective.

It is ideal for bicycle lovers but also by foot is relaxing and at the same time you can admire the lagoon landscape.



Starting from our campsite, take the pedestrian exit and, staying on the same side of the campsite, go **left** (direction Venice). After making a very small part of road you will find the **Hotel Russot**, enter and continue until you find **the path that leads into the park**. Once you enter the Park of S. Giuliano, continue straight on and on the left side you will find the entrance to the naturalistic itinerary.



All along the route you will skirt the Osellino canal which starts from the center of Mestre and flows right at the end of our itinerary in the lagoon. (Punta Bazzera) After the first 3,5 km you will find the **restaurant "Al passo"** on your right, **cross the road** and the path continues ...!







Go straight until you find a **bridge on the left**, cross it and follow the signs for the path until you find the Osellino canal with its **small port**







After passing the small port go straight on until you find **Forte Bazzera** on the left, an ancient military fort built in 1910 to strengthen the Mestre trench.

At this point you have almost arrived at the end of the itinerary, leave the fort behind you and **cross the bridge** on the right, you will find a small barrier, but by foot or bike you can access going around it.

Continue straight ahead until you reach **Punta Bazzera**, you will find a beautiful shaded area with picnic tables from where you can admire the landscape.

We also advise you, before reaching the Punta, to **turn right** (path in yellow) and admire the **small beach of sandbank** overlooking the canal.
